## Window Pane 9 Patch Quilt



## Included in your kit:

24" background fabric
Assorted sample fabrics for blocks, enough for 54 6.5" squares
Binding: 14"
Backing: 63"
Batting: 63"

This quilt is made by sewing 6 large blocks, cutting these blocks into quarters, then rearranging and sewing back together. Finished quilt size: $39^{\prime \prime}$ by $58^{\prime \prime}$. Pattern adapted from a Missouri Star Quilt Tutorial.

## General instructions:

1. Review all information provided with the kit. Before beginning, match the fabric pieces included with the kit instructions.
2. Quilts need to be machine quilted or hand quilted. Quilting can be plain in-the-ditch or as elaborate as you wish to quilt it. Tied quilts do not have the durability for multiple washings, and we ask you not to secure your quilt by that method.
3. If you need assistance in order to complete the quilt, please contact one of the committee members. This program strives to accomplish two goals: It helps us provide quilts to the many worthwhile groups/agencies we serve, and we aim to assist novice quilters to learn basic quilting skills in the process.
4. Remember, a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance is used for all seams.

## Cutting:

- From the sample fabrics, cut $546.5^{\prime \prime}$ squares.
- From the background fabric, cut 12 strips $1.5^{\prime \prime}$ wide by width of fabric. Sub-cut these strips into 36 rectangles $1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 6.5^{\prime \prime}$ and 12 rectangles $1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 20.5^{\prime \prime}$


## Assemble Window Pane Blocks:

1. Select 9 different $6.5^{\prime \prime}$ squares ( $\mathbf{A}$ in diagram below), 6 rectangles $1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 6.5^{\prime \prime}$ ( $\mathbf{B}$ in diagram), and 2 rectangles $1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 20.5^{\prime \prime}$ ( $\mathbf{C}$ in diagram). Assemble block as shown below. Make 6 blocks.

2. Take each of the 6 large $20.5^{\prime \prime}$ blocks and cut once horizontally and once vertically to make 4 10.25" blocks. You will have 24 blocks.


Quilt Assembly:

Layout blocks as shown on front, rotating the blocks to get a pleasing arrangement. Sew 6 rows of 4 blocks each, then sew rows together.

Prepare backing, sandwich with batting, quilt as desired.
Bind the quilt using the enclosed directions.
Attach the enclosed label.
