How to Make a Fabric Label Using an Inkjet Printer

- 1. Make sure you have an inkjet printer, and not a laser printer. This only works for inkjet printers.
- 2. Cut a piece of white quilting fabric bigger than 8.5 x 11 (9 x 11.5 will do)
- 3. Iron this fabric with starch, on both sides about 10 times (five times on each side).
- 4. You are finished ironing when you hold the fabric by one corner and you wave it, it acts like a sheet of paper
- 5. Trim the fabric to 8.5 by 11 inches
- 6. Put the starched, trimmed fabric in your printer
- 7. Using the **COLOR** setting on your printer, print the Piecemakers Quilt label page. (Note: you will get three labels; save the other two labels for your next Comfort Quilt or give the extra labels to a friend.
- 8. Centering the label text and graphic, cut out the label, leaving space to turn under a quarter inch on all sides
- 9. Press under the quarter inch on all sides of the label
- 10. Sew label on to back of quilt
